TOBACCO USE IN THE AFRICAN-AMERICAN COMMUNITY



18.3 % of African-American adults are current smokers.



Smoking among African-American men is higher than among African-American women (21.8% vs. 15.4%).



African-Americans who smoke cigarettes are twice as likely to have a stroke than those who avoid tobacco



The tobacco industry has targeted African-American communities in its advertisements and promotional efforts for menthol cigarettes.



Diseases from smoking kill more African-Americans each year than car crashes, AIDS, murders, and drug and alcohol abuse combined.



In Louisiana, African-American males have the highest smoking prevalence of any racial/ gender group, at 28.2 percent, and smoke at a rate 1.2 times higher than white males.
